

Ambassador of Truth

As you live each day, moments of Compassion are like windows to your Highest Truth. Moments of patience, mercy or power provide glimpses into your soul's Highest Reality. Then you can encourage her to act on what she knows is in keeping with her Highest Truth.

The first step in becoming an ambassador of Truth calls you to absorb into your own heart what you know now to be true. The second step is the act of sharing Truth. Sometimes you may share Truth simply by being a living example of It, at other times you may feel led to offer your perception of what is most true in a given situation.

As you watch the evening Sky turn from blue and white to pink, purple and red it is like watching the turning of your very soul. You are turning away from smallness, turning away from the mundane. Instead, you are slowly opening your heart to the things of greatness, integrity and Truth.
